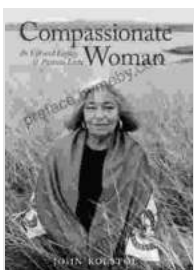


# Patricia Locke: A Legacy of Unwavering Advocacy

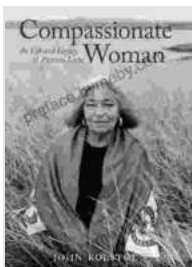
