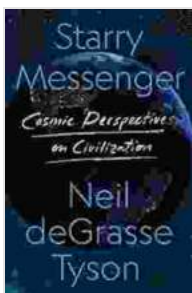


Starry Messenger: Cosmic Perspectives on Civilization
